Member Highlight: Lilly's Tombstone Memories



Lilly's heart has been in Arizona since her college days. She went to visit a friend at the University of Arizona and she was instantly hooked. It has always been her dream to live in the beautiful Arizona desert region. Bob was drawn to the lore of Wyatt Earp, his family and Doc Holiday. After a trip to Tombstone, her husband was hooked too and they made a commitment to become part of the Old West. Starting with renting a small building on historic Allen Street in Tombstone, they opened their first business, Tombstone Sweet Memories AKA Lilly's Frozen Yogurt in August 2012. However, years later when the yogurt machines started needing repairs and replacements, instead of replacing the machines, they took the opportunity to expand. One of the buildings across the street came up for sale and they jumped on the chance to have a bigger space. After being turned down by a bank and a competitor credit union, they turned to American Southwest Credit Union for help. "It didn't make sense that I wasn't able to get a loan from the banks. My rent for the Yogurt Shop was more than the mortgage on the new building, and I'd been paying that lease for over 5 years." After completing the purchase on the larger building with the help of American Southwest Credit Union, they Credit Union, they closed Lilly's Frozen Yogurt in November 2017.

After purchasing the larger building, they searched for a product that would add something

unique to Tombstone and Allen Street. After realizing there were no gun shops in the area at that time, they decided to add guns to their product line. Lilly's Tombstone Memories opened for business on Helldorado Weekend, October 2017. But they didn't stop there. They also purchased two additional buildings just a few doors down.

"I have a dream to revitalize this section of Allen Street. This section of Allen Street has a lot of history with the Oriental and the Birdcage Theatre and the longtime establishments of Longhorn and T. Miller Mercantile. Those are the major draws. But some of the shops are closed so there is less traffic down this way. We need paint and repairs and some interesting businesses to spruce things up. I want to revitalize this section of Allen Street so it can be enjoyed by all who come here and give tourists more variety. This place deserves the best we can give it."

Currently Lilly and Bob have decided to rent out one of the buildings they own. It will be a candle and soap store called Nellie's Wicks and Bricks. It is scheduled to open sometime in March. As for their third building, they are keeping their plans a secret. But whatever it is going to become, it will be successful because Lilly and Bob Hritz are not just dreamers. They are Do-ers and we have every confidence that with their drive and enthusiasm for Tombstone, this section of Allen's street will be better because they are part of the Tombstone community.
